Community Action on Energy and Emissions

Description

Community Action on Energy and Emissions is an initiative of the provincial Ministry of Energy, Mines, and Petroleum Resources, administered by the Fraser Basin Council. It provides funding and research support to advance energy efficiency, energy conservation and emissions reductions measures through studies, policy work, and implementation.

Funding Available

\$10,000 - \$20,000 per community to support the community's commitment to conserving energy, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, and to undertaking unique policy initiatives. CAEE Gold offers \$50,000 per community to support advanced implementation of selected targets.

LiveSmart BC: Efficiency Incentive Program**Description**

LiveSmart BC provides homeowners with incentives to perform energy audits and upgrades to their existing houses. Due to this overwhelming response, the \$60-million program is now fully committed and as such, will no longer provide provincial incentives to new participants, effective end of business Aug. 15, 2009.

Funding Available

Homeowners entering the program after August 16th are still eligible for federal ecoENERGY program incentives. A subsidy for pre-retrofit home energy assessments may also be provided but is currently subject to available funds.

Western Economic Diversification Program**Description**

The aim of the program is to facilitate innovation, promote a competitive and expanded business sector and increase community economic development. Eligible projects must have a strong economical development project component. This funding is always in partnership with other funding groups.

Usually under 50% of the costs. Incremental operating and capital costs that are required to achieve the desired outcomes are eligible for consideration including:

Power Smart - High Performance Building Program**Description**

This BC Hydro program provides financial incentives and tools to help qualified projects: identify energy saving strategies early in the design process; evaluate alternative design options; offset the incremental costs, if any, of the energy-efficient measures; and market the project's high-performance design features and benefits. There are separate programs for large and small buildings. For new construction projects that are at least 6,000 ft².

Funding Available

Up to \$10,000 for studies, depending on building size. Capital incentives vary depending on energy savings.

ecoENERGY Retrofit - Homes

The ecoENERGY retrofit program provides incentives up to \$5,000 to homeowners for upgrading the energy efficiency of their homes. Actual grant amount depends on pre- and post-retrofit Energuide ratings, as determined through a residential energy efficiency assessment. Includes incentives for solar water heaters.

ecoENERGY Retrofit Incentive for Buildings**Description**

Natural Resources Canada's (NRCan's) Office of Energy Efficiency (OEE) offers the ecoENERGY Retrofit Incentive for Buildings, a component of the ecoENERGY Retrofit – Small and Medium Organizations program. The primary objective is to assist owners of small and medium-sized buildings implement energy retrofit projects that reduce energy consumption, increase competitiveness and produce a healthier and more comfortable workspace.

Funding Available

If you have not yet started a new energy efficiency project, you could receive up to \$10 per gigajoule of estimated energy savings, 25 percent of eligible project costs or \$50,000 per project. When applying, you will need to provide a pre-project energy audit of your buildings.

Description	

The ecoENERGY for Aboriginal and Northern Communities Program is intended to help improve energy efficiency and adopt alternative energy sources to reduce dependence on diesel fuel.

The program will assist communities through all stages of project development, including project identification and inception, feasibility and planning studies, financial and project management, equity partnerships, power purchase agreements and project completion.

Incentives will be directed at renewable energy and energy efficiency projects and will include investment in small and micro hydro projects, wind turbines, improved diesel generation efficiency projects, and district heating and home and building heating systems.

Funding Available

For Community Clean Energy Action Plans - \$5,000 - \$15,000 per community

For Energy Efficiency Projects - up to \$100,000 is available.

For Renewable Energy Projects - up to \$250,000 is available.

Work activities within projects may comprise one or more of the program elements, outlined above.

This fund also supports roads and bridges, energy systems, planning and skills development projects and solid waste management. In September of each year, until 2011, First Nations are invited to submit applications for funding that includes project proposals to Indian and Northern Affairs Canada offices. Current call closes Oct. 2, 2009.

Description

Infrastructure Planning Grants are provided for projects to study the feasibility, costs, technology, and location of proposed sewer, water, drainage, transportation, or other local government infrastructure. The grants can be used for community energy planning or energy related feasibility studies.

Green Municipal Fund

Description

Municipalities may apply to the Green Municipal Fund for funding for planning, feasibility studies, and project implementation towards energy/GHG reduction. The fund supports implementation projects through both grants and lower-interest loans. Applications for plans and studies are accepted on a continuous basis. For project implementation funding, an RFP is issued at least once per year for each project category: Energy, Waste, Brownfields, Water, and Transportation. A letter of intent is required first, followed by a full application if accepted. This call for applications will remain open until at least March 31, 2010

Funding Available

For studies and plans, up to 50% of eligible costs to a maximum of \$350,000. For capital projects, up to 80% of eligible costs to a maximum of \$300,000 in grants and \$2M in loans.
